Lab seminar series Fall 2024: The fragile skin of the world

the act of creation as metamorphosis and inoperative potentiality ('the tremble hand' as *supreme mastery*)

The skin is not the site of calculation and measurement – says Jean-Luc Nancy: it is a place of passage, of transit and transport, of traffic and transaction. It is a place where rubbing and irritation, mingling and distinguishing, and colliding and stroking all take place. The skin is erectile, bristling, quivering, retractile, caressing, lubricating, squeezing, trembling. In every way, the skin translates, betrays, transpires, and transudes the palpitating singularity of the enigma of a being-to-itself that is thoroughly outside of itself, near and distant, multiple, always floating and responding to the thrusts of the breezes, breaths, and gusts of the world. In every way, it is the powerful and fragile resonance of everything that brings about a form or a tone of existence.

Creation is a 'poetics of inoperativity', says Agamben, since the model par excellence of this operation that consists in rendering all human works inoperative is poetry itself. '[E]very thing desires and strives to persevere in its being; but at the same time, it resists this desire; at least for an instant it renders it inoperative and contemplates it. Once again, this is a resistance internal to desire, an inoperativity internal to the operation. But it alone confers on conatus its justice and its truth. In a word—and this is, at least in art, the decisive element—its *grace*.'
